



## **SC professor who claimed amnesia indicted for mail and wire fraud**

COLUMBIA, SC (AP) - A former economics professor is facing more charges Wednesday after claiming he had amnesia when \$134 million went missing from funds he managed.

Al Parish has been indicted on 11 counts of mail fraud and wire fraud. Last month, the former Charleston Southern University professor was charged with one count of making false statements and providing false documents to federal investigators.

His attorney, Andy Savage, said Wednesday he hasn't seen the latest charges but said "it wasn't unexpected."

The Securities and Exchange Commission filed a lawsuit accusing Parish of five counts of civil fraud.

The SEC says Parish provided false statements to 300 investors indicating five funds he managed were trading profitably.
